## Why Good Soil?





#### MATTHEW 13

choked them.

- <sup>3</sup> Then He spoke many things to them in parables, saying: "Behold, a sower went out to sow. <sup>4</sup> And as he sowed, some seed fell **by the wayside**; and the birds came and devoured them.
- <sup>5</sup> Some fell on **stony places**, where they did not have much earth; and they immediately sprang up because they had no depth of earth. <sup>6</sup> But when the sun was up they were scorched, and because they had no root they withered away.

  <sup>7</sup> And some fell **among thorns**, and the thorns sprang up and
- <sup>8</sup> But others fell on good ground and yielded a crop: some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty.
- <sup>9</sup> He who has ears to hear, let him hear!"

## But what is "good soil" evangelism & discipleship?

We are going to let Jesus define "good soil" for us, but first it is important to know that Jesus probably spoke this parable many times in various places. And when He spoke, Jesus used the Hebrew or the Aramaic language. So it's no wonder that the Holy Spirit led Matthew, Mark, and Luke to use three different Greek words to give three distinct but interrelated nuances of the full meaning of what Jesus meant by "good soil."

#### Beginning with Matthew's Account

But the ones that fell on the good ground are those who, having heard the word with a noble and good heart, **keep it\*** and bear fruit with patience.

#### \*Greek katecho = κατέχω (kat-ekh'-o)

The word literally means to hold something down; in a positive sense it means to hold it tightly so as to protect it from being taken away.

But these are the ones sown on good ground, those who hear the word, **accept it**,\* and bear fruit: some thirtyfold, some sixty, and some a hundred.

## \*Greek paradechomai = παραδέχοπαι (par-ad-ekh'-o-mi)

The word *dechomai* (receive) is intensified by the prefix *para* (near or by one's side), thus it conveys the idea of embracing.

But he who received seed on the good ground is he who hears the word and **understands it**,\* who indeed bears fruit and produces: some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty.

#### \*Greek suniemi = συνίηπι (soon-ee'ay-mee)

The word literally means to send or bring together, thus in this case to mentally put things together so as to comprehend or make sense of it.

**1a**. Sometimes people hear and see but do not understand.

**REGENERATION** (new birth) occurs instantaneously at a **single point in time**, but *there is* a *sense* in which **conversion** is a **gradual process** that leads up to regeneration.




